Why Bend?

Timely Access: In-take appointments in days, follow-ups scheduled within 30 days.

Affordable, High-Quality Care: Targeted, affordable continuum of outpatient care designed to address total cost of care.

Acuity-aligned Care: Breadth of services enables matching of member need with appropriate provider type.

Measurement-informed Care: Consistent, embedded quality measures, peer-reviewed studies to inform treatment.



Bend has structured care programs tailored to specific needs

MEETING THE NEEDS OF KIDS AND FAMILIES WITH HIGH-QUALITY CARE ACROSS ACUITY

- **Rapid access to support teams** for crisis response, safety planning and ER diversion.
- **Acute stabilization program** supporting ER post-discharge, inpatient step-down care and HEDIS (FUH) measures.
- **Neuropsychological evaluations** ensuring access to affordable, high-quality testing for autism spectrum disorder, brain injury, learning disorders, and more.
- **Integrated collaborative care** supporting pediatric primary care delivery and better engagement with 80% still engaged in care at 6 months.
- **Shared registry** for collaborative care, patient care updates, and billing.

Rapid access to therapy & psychiatry

A WARM HAND-OFF FOR YOUTH IN CRISIS (ER AVOIDANCE / RISK MANAGEMENT)




- **Rapid access to therapy** for crisis stabilization (suicidal ideation, self-harm, aggression, severe panic attacks, etc.) Same-day access for calls before 4pm local.
- **Rapid access to psychiatry** for anyone needing a one-time visit within 7 days (new medications, medication adjustments, post-hospital and post-ER visits).
- **Post visit, same-day triage** to the most appropriate care option: Intensive care, Collaborative care, Neuropsychological Eval or others as needed







A set of **12-week**, specialized programs targeting children and adolescents **ages 8-25** who require more frequent behavioral health treatment than traditional outpatient care but do not need 24-hour hospitalization.



ABOUT BEND COCM:

- Based on traditional CoCM⁽¹⁾, enhanced with additional interventions.
- Primary care clinics refer directly to Bend via portal or EHR
- Bend delivers coaching, therapy, care management, and meds consultation
- PCP's receive monthly patient snapshot of care plan and progress
- Health system / clinic bills the payer for minutes of behavioral care provided by Bend
- Over 70% of referrals enroll in Bend compared to 20%-30% for community-based referrals



Outcome Studies

PEER-TO-PEER PAPER SUMMARIES

- **Anxiety symptoms decreased in 73% and depressive symptoms decreased in 73%** of kids with Bend ([Huffman et al., 2023](#)).
- **Symptoms of ADHD or oppositional behaviors improved in 63%** of children & teens while in care with Bend ([Lawrence-Sidebottom et al., 2023](#)).
- Teens and caregivers who report higher service satisfaction and perceived usefulness **participate in more coaching and therapy sessions** ([Huffman et al., 2023](#)).
- **Caregiver sleep problems and parental stress improve for 77% and 73% of caregivers**, respectively, whose children are in care with Bend ([Huffman et al., 2023](#)).
- For children and teens with moderate symptoms, there is **reliable change in anxiety and depressive symptoms within two coaching sessions and stable reliable change within six sessions** ([Lawrence-Sidebottom et al., 2023](#)).
- **Disordered eating behaviors improve for 62% of teens with Bend** ([Huffman et al., 2023](#)).
- **Anxiety and depressive symptoms improve over care with Bend for members with elevated risk (e.g., of suicide attempt)**, despite having more severe anxiety and depressive symptoms than other members ([Lawrence-Sidebottom et al., in review](#)).
- **Sleep problems improve in 77% of children and teens with Bend**, and those with improvements in mental health exhibit greater changes in sleep ([Lawrence-Sidebottom et al., in review](#)).
- **Symptoms of burnout improve for 56% of caregivers, and number of missed days of work decrease for 70% of caregivers**, while their child is in care with Bend ([Lawrence-Sidebottom et al., in review](#))
- **For children with symptoms of posttraumatic stress, these symptoms decrease in 93% during care with Bend** ([Lawrence-Sidebottom et al., in review](#))


Social Determinants of Health (SDoH) Clinical Process

Social determinants of health significantly impact mental health outcomes – especially for the most vulnerable populations.

Factors such as education, income level, and environment must be considered when providing treatment to achieve better health outcomes in these populations.




